

### COMMUNITY FOOD PROGRAM



### DEVICE LENDING PROGRAM

In the time of social distancing, we are more dependent than ever on the Internet to stay connected. Recognizing that technology needs might present a barrier to some of our families, Peaslee established a device lending library so everyone could continue to engage in our virtual programs and school. Laptops were available to be checked out by families who needed them, and earbuds were distributed so users could tune in without disrupting others in their homes.

Peaslee's effort to support our neighbors is central to the work of the Community Food Program. In 2020, in partnership with the Cincinnati Interfaith Workers Center and the Freestore Foodbank, Peaslee distributed nearly 2,500 boxes of groceries to families experiencing hardship as a result of the Covid-19 crisis. We have strengthened our bond with several local schools—Rothenberg Preparatory Academy, St. Francis Seraph School, and Roberts Academy—who welcomed us to distribute groceries with the help and support of their staff. We also supported Seven Hills Neighborhood House food pantry and Price Hill Recreation Center, whose staff distributed groceries to residents monthly. In April 2020, our commitment to observing safety protocols in food distribution was highlighted in a news story by WCPO. The Community Food Program is an inspiring example of community support in action!



### AGENTS OF CHANGE

Agents of Change youth stayed connected online to celebrate milestones together, including birthdays and graduations. During their virtual summer program, Agents met for weekly book groups and social change activities. They continued to meet remotely in the fall to discuss current events and community issues including Ohio's Stand Your Ground law, "cancel culture," and art as activism. Twenty students participated this year.



Peaslee designed and produced a more polished prototype of The Movement, the educational cooperative card game that was created by our Agents of Change. We are excited for final testing, and look forward to professional production so we can share the game as one of our Social Justice Education offerings.

### **SOCIAL JUSTICE EDUCATION**





Residents of Over-the-Rhine and Price Hill, among other communities, continued serving as Community Mentors co-teaching in Peaslee's junior seminar for Miami University's Urban Cohort program. 2020's lessons on structural injustice and social change were delivered virtually, with the help of laptops from Peaslee's device lending library.

Groups seeking to learn about issues of race and class in the community continued to rely on Peaslee to facilitate Affordable Housing Simulations, Community Journey walking tours, and service learning reflections. Despite the pandemic, Peaslee educated and engaged over 400 people around these vital community issues.

### EDUCATION-BASED ORGANIZING

Peaslee also worked in coalition to develop a website and public presence for the Communities Act Now (CAN) action platform. CAN provides a critical road map to improve development practices in Cincinnati by addressing our city's well-documented equity problems. It consists of four impactful and actionable public policy initiatives, including our own Equitable Development Rubric.

Public support for and use of the Equitable Development Rubric has grown across residents, councils, and organizations. Our ongoing education and support has evolved to include a Community Council guidebook and toolkit for the Rubric; it will soon be available for neighborhood groups.



Our piano program served 17 students ages 7-13 in 2020. Despite a pause of in-person lessons and events, our students continued to practice and progress at home with online flashcards, music books from Peaslee's lending library, and virtual lessons. During the summer they submitted video performances for a virtual recital on social media, and had the opportunity to earn prizes by participating in a practice challenge! This year Peaslee also introduced group lessons and office hours outside of formal lesson time.

In July, we were heartbroken when our former piano teacher Atarah Jablonsky ("Mrs. J") passed away at age 92. With her thoughtful encouragement, good humor, and depth of knowledge as a teacher, she enriched the lives of her students, their families, and everyone who had the privilege of working with her. Atarah is dearly missed, but her legacy lives on whenever the sound of music floats through the hallways of Peaslee. The music lending library we established in 2020 is dedicated in her memory.




